- Q. What does the dog do to help?
- A. He can open doors using the automatic buttons, close doors with his nose, fetch items off the ground and bark for help as needed. Elwood will only listen to me when I say commands.

Our Sibshops series is a facilitated partnership between Community Support for Families and Rural Response for Healthy Children. The Sibshops group is for siblings of children who have a developmental or physical disability, autism or a mental health concern. It is an opportunity to have fun together while receiving peer support, sharing their sibling relationship and exploring the gifts and challenges of being a sibling to someone with disabilities.
